



Ishmael by Daniel Quinn

How can we save the world from ourselves? As a renewing summer activity, read Daniel Quinn's classic best-selling novel *Ishmael: An Adventure of the Mind and Spirit*, available at <u>Ishmael: A Novel: Quinn, Daniel: 8601401253082: Books - Amazon.ca</u> Our first Formation session in September will be an open-ended discussion of this utterly unique and compelling masterpiece.

Prayer: Our Deepest Longing by Ronald Rolheiser

With simple, down-to-earth language, Rolheiser illustrates the importance of prayer and offers techniques for how to pray, using examples from daily life, Scripture, and contemporary writers. He delves into the places that we fear to go with our issues about prayer, encouraging us with gentle kindness and words of hope and inspiration.





Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing In A Divided World by Katharine Hayhoe

In *Saving Us,* Hayhoe argues that when it comes to changing hearts and minds, facts are only one part of the equation. We need to find shared values in order to connect our unique identities to collective action. This is not another doomsday narrative about a planet on fire. It is a multilayered look at science, faith, and human psychology, from an icon in her field—recently named chief scientist at The Nature Conservancy.

Indian Horse by Richard Wagamese

With compassion and insight, author Richard Wagamese traces through his fictional characters the decline of a culture and a cultural way. For Saul, taken forcibly from the land and his family when he's sent to residential school, salvation comes for a while through his incredible gifts as a hockey player. But in the harsh realities of 1960s Canada, he battles obdurate racism and the spirit-destroying effects of cultural alienation and displacement.



As part of your summer reading, consider reading Ishmael in preparation for the fall Adult Formation book study or read one of the other books which address topics that we will continue to talk about and pursue in the future. If you have questions, see Kyle or Mel.
