
Lent, beginning on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14), is the 40-day (plus Sundays) season before the celebration of Easter. Lent invites us to step aside from the pressuring demands of our every-day lives and to reflect on the relationship between us and God, the relationships between people, and the relationship between people and the rest of creation.

The season of Lent is often associated with the spiritual practice of fasting, giving up something that could come between you and God. You might try this, or another spiritual practice that helps you to renew the relationship between you and God. Here are a few ideas of ways to journey through the season of Lent, which begins this year with Ash Wednesday on February 14 and ends with Easter on March 31.

Here are some suggestions:


<u>Common Prayer</u>, a liturgy for ordinary radicals, is daily prayer you can follow for the season of Lent or year-round. https://commonprayer.net/

<u>Pray as you go</u> is a prayerful, musical, scriptural podcast from the Jesuits. It's about 15 minutes long and ca set your day in the right space any time of year, including Lent. (Available at https://pray-as-you-go.org/home/ or as an app on your phone)



Unburdened. A Lenten Journey toward Forgiveness. This book by Carol Penner that invites us to hear God's call to move away from brokenness into the healing and hope of the resurrection. Through prayers, scripture reflections, and stories about individuals and communities, be encouraged to take small steps toward the freedom found in forgiveness.
